East Hampton Senior Services provides transportation

Monday, Tuesday Wednesday, Thursday 10:30am to 3:30pm We pickup from your home to the senior center or other local places, (hairdresser, barber, bank, post office) If the schedule allows we will provide local medical trips, too. We also provide monthly recreational day trips.

The River Valley Transit provides rides.

RVT is a transit agency operated by the Estuary Transit District. RVT provides a variety of services including traditional fixed routes, ADA Paratransit, Dial-A-Ride, and On-Demand Xtra mile service.

The service area encompasses most of Middlesex County and services 17 municipalities. Please see the Fare schedule in the RVT brochure.

All services are open to the general public with no age or disability restrictions. Dial-A-Ride senior 60+ by donation transportation is made possible by a grant from the Senior Resources Agency on Aging with Title III funds made available under the Older Americans Act. Dial-A -Ride Senior Fare requires pre-registration by calling customer service at 860-510-0429.



Coming Soon: River Valley Transit Xtra Mile pilot program:

River Valley Transit: Introducing three pilots serving Madison and Guilford, and portions of East Hampton and Middletown.

Commuters within designated service areas will be able to simply push a button on a smartphone

app or make a phone call. Then they will get picked up by a small bus or shuttle, which will drop them off within the service area. RVT is looking to launch this program this summer.
