






Proposed Spending Plan by Major Function Total Budget Request: \$45,958,311






Budget Allocation 2008 vs. 2018





2017-2018 PROPOSED BUDGET ALLOCATION OF TOTAL INCREASE \$3,006,707






Expenditures

- Salary Increases: Full-time \$90,026 (Includes \$33,987 to bring the approved FY 2017 mid-year officer to full year funding); Part-time (\$6,781); Overtime \$6,124
- Medical Benefits: (\$146,132) (Switching from our current HSA to the Connecticut Partnership 2.0 Plan)
 - Not moving to the plan is estimated to cost an additional \$300,000.
- Pension:
 - Defined Benefit \$47,728
 - Defined Contribution \$20,905
- Workers compensation and liability insurance (estimated): \$86,874
- CNG Community Contribution: \$50,000
- Building Department: \$13,050 (Additional hours for part-time staff)
- Public Works: \$18,800 (Line striping and catch basin cleaning)
- Police Canine: \$10,000
- Fire Marshal: \$10,800 (Software update for new fire safety code)
- Information Technology: \$8,000 (Disaster recovery cloud backup)
 - Total above \$209,394









Full Time Staff

Town Operations Proposed Budget Change Total Change: \$281,352






Debt Payments Bonds & Capital Leases

Revenues

We have adjusted our estimates in the following revenue categories:


- Mill Rate Stabilization (\$267,392)
 - In FY 2017 \$400,000 was transferred into the General Fund. The planned transfer for FY 2018 is \$132,608.
- Grants (\$1,487,483)
 - The Governor's proposed budget call for significant cuts in municipal funding. The major proposed changes are below:
 - Education Cost Sharing (\$3,338,935)
 - Special Education Excess Cost \$1,727,122
 - Grants for Municipal Projects (\$18,973)
 - Municipal Revenue Sharing \$115,649

The net affect of the proposed reductions are equal to over 1.3 mills.

- Delinquent tax collections \$120,000
 - The Tax Office is aggressively pursuing delinquent taxes through all possible means.




% of Total Revenue




■ 2008 ■ 2013 ■ 2018 Estimate













Grand List

- Grand list remains relatively unchanged from the FY2017 budgeted estimate.
- The FY2018 grand list is currently valued at \$1,128,957,021. The budgeted estimate is \$1,126,000,000. The difference takes into account estimates for adjustments from the Board of Assessment appeals and litigation.
- The final FY2017 grand list compared to the current FY2018 grand list represents a 0.50% increase.










MILL VALUE TOTAL 4.29 MILLS
