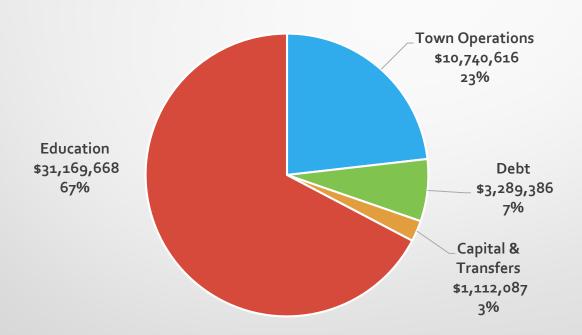

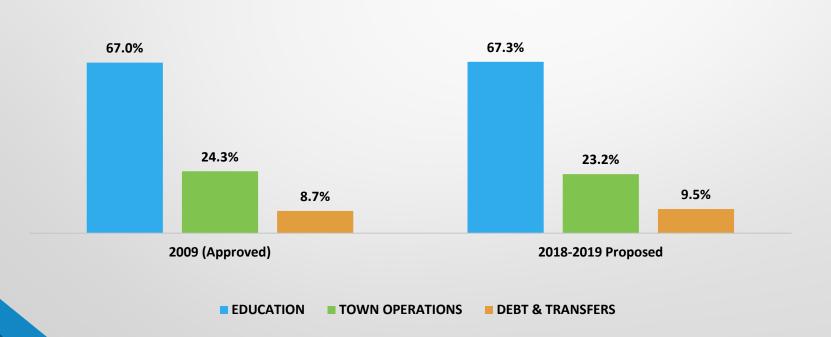

Proposed Spending Plan by Major Function Total Budget Request: \$46,311,757







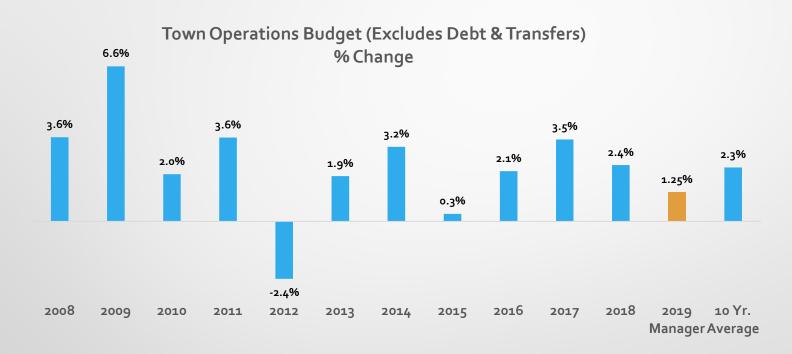
2018-2019 Proposed Budget Allocation of Total Increase

  - Defined Benefit \$13,862
  - Defined Contribution \$5,702

  - Total above \$117,684

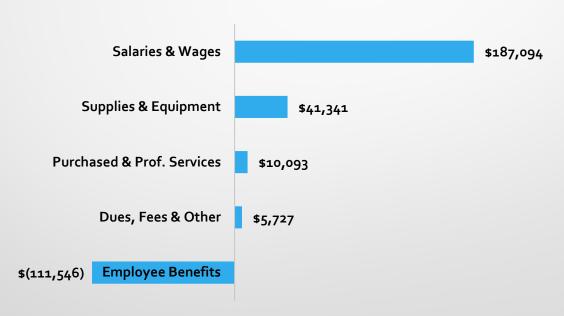


## Full Time Staff

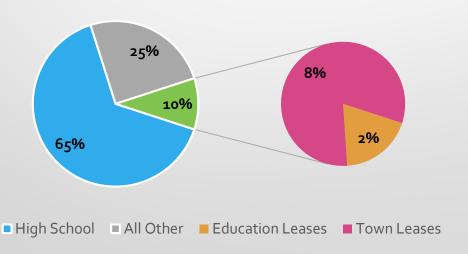


# 2018-2019 Manager Budget Debt Payments

**Bonds & Capital Leases** 

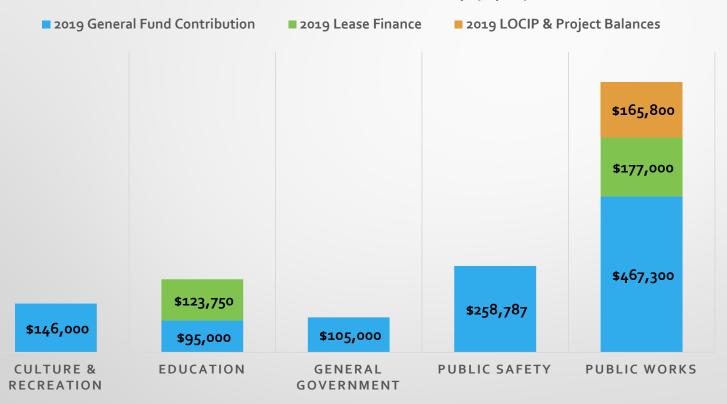


FY 2019 Debt Breakdown

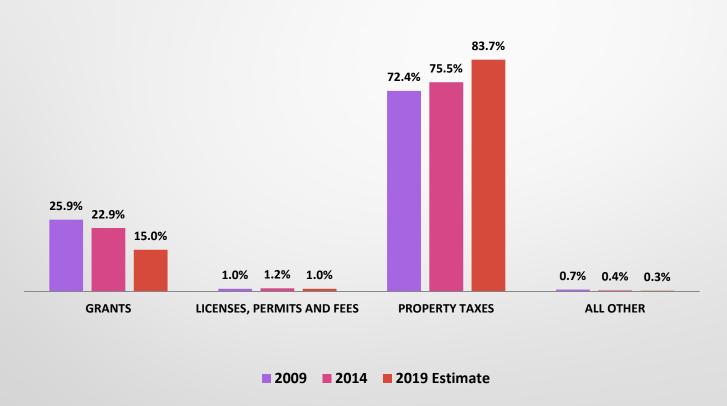
We have adjusted our estimates in the following revenue categories:

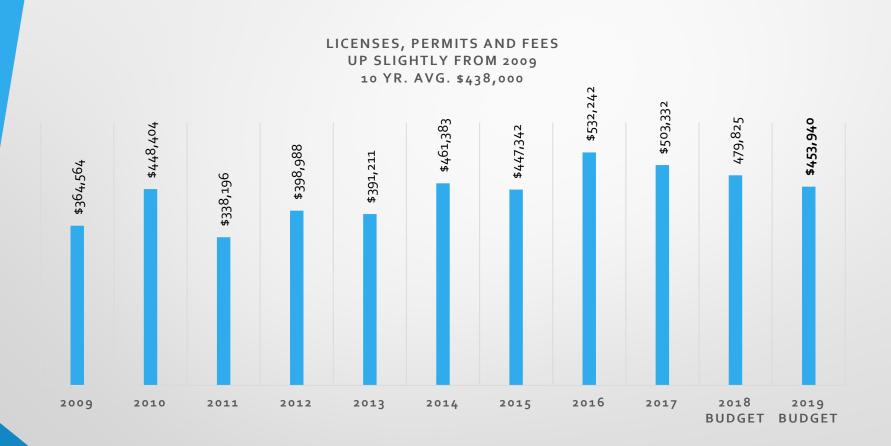
- Mill Rate Stabilization (\$104,608)
- Grants (\$1,441,832)
  - The Governor's bi-annual budget calls for significant cuts in municipal funding. Major changes are below:
    - Education Cost Sharing (\$1,200,901)
    - MRSA Sales Tax Sharing- (\$263,149)
    - State Owned Property PILOT (\$31,749)
    - Mashantucket Pequot/Mohegan (\$35,141)
    - Municipal Stabilization Grant \$90,522

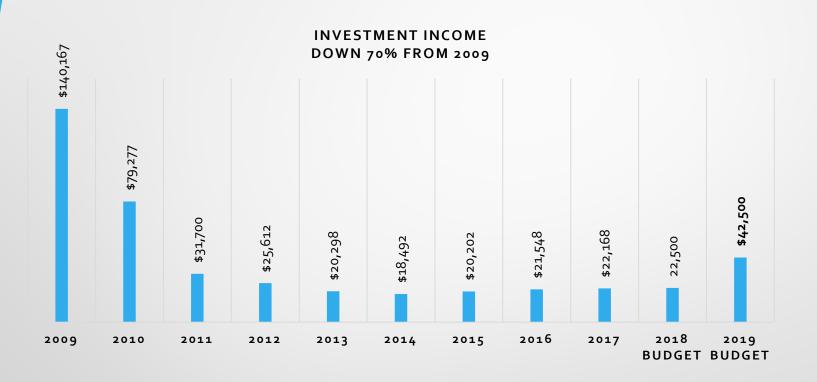
The net affect of the proposed reductions are equal to 1.3 mills.

- Delinquent tax collections \$92,000
  - The Tax Office continues to pursue delinquent tax collections through all possible means.

#### % of Total Revenue







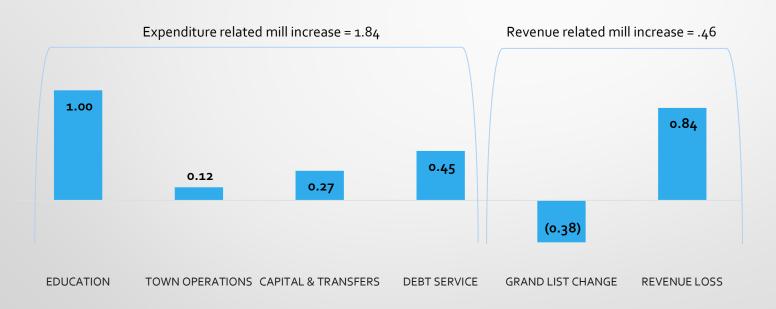
### **Grand List**

- Grand list grew by approximately 1.00%.
- The FY 2019 grand list is currently valued at \$1,140,754,919. The budgeted estimate is \$1,139,887,929. The difference takes into account estimates for adjustments from the Board of Assessment appeals and litigation.
- Grand list growth will generate an additional \$427,000 in new tax revenue.
