CASES JUMP AGAIN

East Hampton, CT, July 16, 2021 – Unfortunately, after two weeks with no new cases, East Hampton had six new COVID-19 cases reported in the last week. Early information for next week's reports indicate additional cases are being seen. According to information from the Chatham Health District, transmission is generally occurring among unvaccinated individuals and the spread is often related to travel and social events where safety practices were not followed. Many cases are occurring within younger segments of the Town population, which is similar to elsewhere in the State. With care and the vaccine, it is expected that the community can turn the trend of increasing cases around. The vaccine remains an important factor in protecting the community.

All residents that are eligible are encouraged to become vaccinated. As of July 14, DPH information shows that just over 63%, or about 8,145, of the Town's residents have received at least the first dose of the vaccines. With about 15% of the Town population not eligible for vaccination, it is important that all who are able get the shot. Detailed information shows that virtually all Town residents over 65 years old are vaccinated, about 69% of residents between 45 and 64 years old are vaccinated and about 62% of eligible residents between 15 and 45 have been vaccinated. The information also shows that just over 55% of Town residents between 12 and 15 have been vaccinated. Most new vaccinations are occurring among the 12 to 15 year old age group. Everyone over 12 years old is eligible and all are encouraged to be vaccinated as soon as possible. Everyone, and especially those who have not been vaccinated, is safest wearing a mask or face covering when close to others indoors. However, mask wearing is not required in most non-education-related Town facilities for those that are fully vaccinated. Those who are not vaccinated and those who are more comfortable with a mask are encouraged to wear one. Certain Town programs and activities continue to encourage mask wearing for all visitors and participants due to the populations served. Individual businesses are also able to determine their own policies.
