


Introducing "The Spirit of Old Home Day at Home!" Participants will decorate their homes, businesses or an entire neighborhood! Think of it as a large float.

### **Town Manager's Corner**

Hello East Hampton,

Summer is right around the corner. As I write this, we are heading into some beautiful, sunny 80-degree days and are getting ready for summertime fun. We are working to put the pandemic behind us and looking forward to a great season of outdoor activities throughout the community.

Last year at this time, I talked about moving forward to "normalcy" and I think we are finally getting there. We are able to engage in many activities that we may not have been able to or may not have felt comfortable doing in the past. Masks are optional! Some members of our community are not eligible or cannot take the vaccine or choose not to for a reason important to them. There are parts of



Town government that will continue to wear masks, especially those areas working with youth or other vulnerable groups like schools, the library and certain recreation programs. I urge the community to be safe and to be respectful of those who choose to continue to wear a mask, whatever the reason.

By the time this reaches homes, the Town's budget process should have gone to referendum on June 8. Staff, the Board of Finance, the Board of Education and the Town Council worked hard to draft a budget that continues to move the community forward and does so in a reasonable, cost-effective way. While there is no planned use of

cash reserves this year, strategic use of funds available from the current fiscal year was made to reduce costs in the future. Please make sure you voice your opinion.

At Town Meetings held this spring, the community authorized work on the athletic facilities at the High School and the purchase of the Christopher Pond prop-

erty. The High School work will improve the tennis courts, baseball field, track and soccer field. That project will be bid shortly based on a plan approved by the Town Council and work is expected to take place during the summer. The purchase of the Christopher Pond property, which was suggested in the Town's Nine Elements Plan to protect the lake, will allow the Town to make improvements on the property and in the pond to help Lake Pocotopaug. Both are good steps toward providing and protecting community resources.

Thank you again for reading the Events Magazine. As always, let the Town Manager's Office or the Economic Development Commission know if you have ideas for improving it. Also, it bears repeating; please support local businesses including those that advertise in the Events Magazine. 

The 2021-22 winter application period will begin in August, appointments can be booked starting June 21st. Due to the length of these appointments, walk-ins cannot be accommodated.

# **East Hampton Community Garden**



There is an eight-member board that has been meeting weekly to hear updates from sub-committees and working on the logistics of the Community Garden, which will be called East Hampton Community Garden.

The Parks & Recreation Board unanimously supported the garden and the Town Council approved an easement for the property.

# **East Hampton Youth & Family Services**

East Hampton Youth & Family Services continues to accept new clients for counseling services. This service is available free of charge, to any resident. Simply call the office at 860-267-9982 and a request for service referral can be completed over the phone. Flexible hours are offered to accommodate clients' needs and schedules. \*Insurance is not required to receive services.

The Juvenile Review Board (JRB), which focuses on restorative justice, is up and running. This program removes the focus on discipline and punitive measures and instead emphasizes curative practices. The JRB works closely with local law enforcement and the schools, along with the families and the minors involved. Its overall goal is to work as a diversion process for minors, rather than sending them to juvenile court.





### OFFICE OF THE **Collector of Revenue**

### Tax Bills

Tax bills on the Grand List of 2020 for real estate, personal property and motor vehicles will be mailed on June 29, 2021. Taxes become due and payable on July 1, 2021 and delinquent after August 2, 2021.

The tax bills for real estate accounts that are being escrowed through a mortgage company will be sent directly to the bank. If you receive a real estate tax bill that should be paid by your mortgage company, please forward the bill to them immediately.

If you have not received a tax bill you are responsible for paying,

please contact the Collector of Revenue at kmerrifield@easthamptonct.gov for a duplicate copy. As owners of property, taxpayers are responsible to see that taxes are paid when due.

### **Motor Vehicle Clearances**

All motor vehicle tax bills that are in your name must be paid in full with cash, bank check or money order to receive an immediate clearance with Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV). All other methods of payment including payments made online will take 10 business days to process.

### FROM THE Fire Marshal

### Fireworks & Special Effects

With the Fourth of July around the corner it is very important to have an understanding of fireworks in regard to what is allowed and not allowed in order to protect you and those around you from pain, injury, or unexpected fires.

### Below are some Fireworks **Safety Tips:**

- Never allow children to play with or ignite fireworks
- Never try to re-light or pick up fireworks that have not ignited fully
- Keep a bucket of water or a garden hose handy in case of fire or other mishaps
- Make sure fireworks are legal in your area before buying or using them
- Avoid using alcohol while handling fireworks

The safest way to enjoy fireworks is to attend a public display by a licensed professional.

### What is legal in Connecticut?

"Sparklers" means a wire or stick coated with pyrotechnic composition that produces a shower of sparks upon ignition.

"Fountain" means any cardboard or heavy paper cone or cylindrical tube contacting pyrotechnic mixture that upor ignition produces a shower of colored sparks or smoke. "Fountain" includes, but is not limited to, (A) a spike fountain, which provides a spike for insertion into the ground, (B) a base fountain which has a wooden or plastic base for placing on the ground, or (C) a handle fountain which is a

handheld device with a wooden or cardboard handle.

Must be of 16 years of age or older to legally use sparklers or fountains.

Connecticut Legal Fireworks are Labeled with:

- "Emits Showers of Sparks"
- Non- Explosive and Non-Aerial

### What is illegal?

Consumer Fireworks that are illegal in Connecticut are generally labeled with the following:

- Shoots Flaming Balls
- Emits a Report
- Explosive
- Flammable

Any Firework that goes Aerial or Explodes is Illegal.

Since it's first publication in 1950, buried inside every monthly issue of *Golf Digest* magazine is some article, reference or subliminal message that reminds golfers to "Keep your head down; swing through the ball..."

This "keep your head down; swing through the ball" mantra preached by professional instructors to golf enthusiasts of all skill levels recognizes that mastery of the basic tenets of the game is the foundation upon which proficiency is built and success is achieved.

Similarly, proficiency and success in the fire service is built upon the skillful execution of protocols, procedures and techniques that not only mitigate the effects of the emergency incident but also ensures the safety and well-being of all involved. Much like golf or any other skill-based activity, continual repetition and practice creates "muscle memory" that instills and constantly refines functional patterns for improving execution.

To that end, East Hampton Fire Chief Greg Voelker has outlined a training curriculum for EHVFD firefighters over the next twelve months that centers around a "back-to-basics" approach designed to reinforce essential skills. In addition to the mandatory annual training requirements for Hazmat responses, bloodborne pathogens, CPR and live burn training, East Hampton firefighters will be drilled on more rudimentary topics such as hose advancement, relay pumping, water supply/tanker operations, vehicle fire suppression, extrication techniques, forcible

entry and building search, ladder operations and other related subjects.

Additionally, with motor vehicle crashes during incident response being the second-leading cause of line-of-duty deaths among emergency personnel nationwide, the Department will conduct an Emergency Vehicle Operations Certification course for all members that emphasizes safe driving techniques not only for apparatus drivers, but also for individuals responding to emergencies in their personal vehicles.

For Fire Chief Voelker, providing training opportunities is a primary responsibility of fire service leadership: "Our volunteers put themselves on the line every day to protect the public, and it is my job to make sure they are properly equipped and trained to meet the challenges they encounter. This year's focus on reinforcing basic skills will help us not only maintain a high level of readiness and proficiency but will also work to avoid complacency and prevent the formation of bad habits. Each incident is unique, and it is your training will most often guide you to a safe and successful outcome."

The East Hampton Volunteer Fire Department remains an all-volunteer organization dedicated to serving and protecting the community's residents and visitors. # **East Hampton Police Department**

The East Hampton Police Department would like to remind everyone that with warmer weather upon us, there is a need to exercise additional care while travelling about the town. You will start to see an increase in pedestrian traffic and motorists need to pay special attention to the pedestrian crosswalks in town. Motorists need to be mindful of the posted speed limits and take extra precautions when traveling around high traffic areas, such as the lake or areas where children may be playing.

The Police Department also wants to remind everyone to lock their car doors and never leave valuables in plain sight. Secure them in the trunk or another secure location.

Phone scams are on the rise and they are becoming much more sophisticated as they attempt to access your personal information. Never give out your personal information over the phone. Companies like Eversource will not threaten to shut off your power over the phone, they will send you something in the mail. They will also not demand immediate payment by credit card or ask for the routing number of your bank account to set up an automatic payment. If it sounds suspicious ask the caller for a call back number and verify that number through an internet search of the company that the caller states he is from. Additionally, please feel free to contact the Police Department who can assist you in determining if the call is scam.



### **Land Use Department**

East Hampton is part of a seventeen-town regional planning area known as the Lower Connecticut River Valley Council of Governments (RiverCOG). The RiverCOG takes on many tasks throughout the region such as overseeing transportation projects, assisting in grant management for various funding types, and prepares several planning documents on a regular cycle. The River-COG was formed in 2012 with the merger of two smaller agencies and is in the final stages of preparing its first Regional Plan of Conservation and Development (RPOCD).

The RPOCD is a visionary policy document. This means that it is not binding on municipalities and commissions in the region. Rather, it is an aspirational document, identifying preferred land uses, development patterns and types, and desirable areas for conservation over the next 10 years, based on existing and emerging regional trends and challenges. Overall, the job of an RPOCD is to balance the needs of both conservation and development, paying par-

ticular attention to areas where these interests compete as well as those where there is mutual support. The RPOCD can be a tool used to guide funding for projects in the region and its creation is required under Connecticut Statute (CGS Chapter 127 Section 8-35a). You may be familiar with the East Hampton POCD which was adopted in 2016. The RPOCD is similar, but with a regional perspective.

The Regional Planning Committee (RPC) and their consultant, Fitzgerald and Halliday, have completed the initial draft and are looking for comments from residents, business owners, and employees of the region. The RiverCOG has created an easy to use website to view the draft document and submit comments. A Public Hearing will be held on June 30, 2021 with the goal of adoption shortly thereafter. We welcome your feedback!

### **Department of Public Works**

The Department of Public Works has begun its routine spring maintenance program. Public Works crews have started to address routine spring maintenance items such as pothole patching, curbing replacement, and sign maintenance. Winter equipment is being examined and evaluated, necessary repairs are being made, and routine maintenance items are being performed.



The department has also begun the Edgerton Street drainage replacement project preparation for reconstruction of Edgerton Street in the Spring of 2022. Public Works crews have completed pavement shimming work on White Birch Road and Mott Hill Road in anticipation of chip sealing these roads in early June. As a reminder when roads are newly chip sealed please keep speeds to 15 MPH on loose stone.

Public Works crews have started regrading and addressing drainage issues on the 8 miles of gravel roads within the town's road network. Road sweeping is also underway and will continue until the town's entire paved road network has been addressed.

Cemetery clean-up and mowing will be completed prior to Memorial Day. Roadside mowing will begin in May and continue through summer and fall.

The Transfer Station will be open Saturdays from 7:30 a.m. until 3:30 p.m.

adding Community Garden to the memo line. The Shulman family made the first donation with a very generous \$3,000.

A Rotary Community Corp will be set up which will allow for securing yearly grants for the garden.

For the first year the garden will aim to have 30 plots of 4 feet x 10 feet each. It is planned to erect permanent fencing around the periphery of the gardens. Carl and Jennifer will be seeking donations representing the Board, from local businesses to help obtain gardening tools, a shed, fencing and plants.

Some members of the Garden Club have volunteered to be a sub-committee and have been meeting and providing invaluable information for the incorporation of the garden.

When everything is ready to accept applications for garden plots, Parks & Recreation will be providing registration, similar to what you would do to sign up for any town activity.

Jack Solomon has designed a solar powered irrigation system and planting is planned to start around Memorial Day.

### **Town Clerk's Office**

JUNE IS DOG LICENSE MONTH! All dogs 6 months or older must be licensed each year in the town where they reside. A current rabies certificate is required for all dogs, and a neutered/spayed certificate is required for dogs that will be licensed for the first time.

Dog licenses may be obtained at the Town Clerk's Office Monday, Wednesday and Thursday, 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m., Tuesday, 8:00 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. and Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. or by mail. If applying by mail, include a check for the proper fee, made payable to the East Hampton Town Clerk, all certificates, and a self-addressed, stamped envelope, and mail to Town Clerk, Town Hall, 1 Community Drive, East Hampton, CT 06424. All certificates will be returned with the new license and tag.

### REAL ESTATE CHANGE OF MAILING ADDRESS

The Office of the Assessor is responsible for all Real Estate mailing addresses. Once a mailing address is updated in our office the change is updated in the Collector of Revenue's Office for tax and/or sewer billing. If you recently changed your mailing address, please visit our office or our Change of Address Form on the Assessor's page of our website at https://www. easthamptonct.gov/assessor

Additionally, call the office just to confirm your mailing address. Quite often, tax bills are sent to mortgage companies. To receive additional mail from the Town an address update might be needed. This is especially true for Post Office box holders in the Middle Haddam and Cobalt sections of East Hampton.

### ELDERLY AND TOTALLY DISABLED RENTER'S REBATE PROGRAM

Residents 65 years of age or totally disabled may be eligible for a rent rebate under CT State law within the Municipality where they currently reside; income guidelines apply and are adjusted each year. Applications will be available April 1, 2021 and must be filed on or before October 1, 2021 with the Assessor's Office.

Per the State of CT Office of Policy and Management for the 2020 calendar year, the maximum income for a single taxpayer was set at \$37,600. The maximum income for a married couple was set at \$45,800. Additionally, the applicant must have lived in CT for one year.

The Assessor's Office is open Monday, Wednesday, Thursday 8:00am to 4:00pm, Tuesday 8:00am to 6:30pm and Friday 8:00am to 12:30pm. We can be reached at 860-267-2510.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic our program offerings are ever changing based on local and state guidelines. Please check out www.easthamptonrec.com for the latest schedule and offerings. Our programs all follow in accordance with current CDC and OEC guidelines. Program enrollments are accepted online at www.easthamptonrec.com. Registration forms are available online at www.easthamptonrec.com or at the Parks and Recreation Office.

All registration forms must include payment. Payment is required at the time of registration. All registrations are taken on a first come, first serve basis. We accept MasterCard and Visa. Please make checks payable to East Hampton Parks and Recreation. Cash payments should be made in the office only. Please do not try to register or pay program instructors unless indicated.

Registration confirmations are available by e-mail if subscribed to on your main account page at www.easthamptonct.gov. No other confirmations are provided; however, if you have registered with us and paid, you will be on the final roster.

### **Program Refund Policy:**

If you are unable to attend a program you have registered for, please contact us. You must contact us 7 days before a program starts to receive a 100% refund. Cancelations inside of 7 days will receive a 50% refund or be issued an account credit for another activity. After the program starts no refunds will be issued. Our ability to refund money for trip cancellations depends on our contractual agreement with the travel companies.

In the event of inclement weather, all programs are cancelled if school is closed or has an early dismissal. Cancellation information is posted on WFSB Channel 3 Early Warning Network. Households who have subscribed to the online registration site's e-mail notifications will receive an e-mail regarding the cancellation.

Program times are subject to change based on enrollment numbers. Programs will be cancelled if the minimum enrollment number is not reached. Applications for reduced-tuition scholarships are available at the Parks and Recreation Office and Youth and Family Services. All information is strictly confidential. This is an application process. Only programs run directly by East Hampton Parks and Recreation qualify.

A portion of your enrollment fee may be put into your Special Revenue Program account for the East Hampton Parks & Recreation Department to maintain or enhance this program or other programs. This fund is not associated with the General Fund of the Town of East Hampton.



### What is the Passive House standard? In a

**How much does Passive House cost?** When designed and planned from the onset, building to a Passive House standard does not necessarily cost much more than conventional construction. And incentives available from Eversource can help offset the incremental costs.

What should developers know? Passive House is a performance-based standard that requires a comprehensive integrated design approach. Thus, it should be a clear goal at the very start of the process, and in some cases even before design drawings have been developed.
