Dear Ms. Mathieu:

The Town of East Hampton has come up with a plan of action for the 2 water systems that have tested positive for PFAS. The Town feels that the source water as well as the treated water test results are below the action level set by the EPA and the CT DPH of 70 PPT, we should remain on the cautious side.

The Town of East Hampton plans on posting our PFAS notice on the town website as well as mailing out a copy to all of the town water system users in the Village Center and Royal Oaks Systems. The town plans on having a public forum with the help from DPH in the near future.

The town would operate the Village Center well #1 on an alternating bases with well #2 since the treated water tests show non-detect. Both wells are treated through 4 Carbon Filters with Calgon Filtrasorb 400 media which has been replaced in 2019. The town will test the treated water for PFAS quarterly for the next year to ensure that the carbon is working.

The town will operate the Memorial School well as needed to supplement the Royal Oaks System since this well is well below 70PPT. The town will install a Carbon Filter on the well at the Memorial School to treat the school well. We will install one 6 cubic foot filter loaded with Calgon Filtrasorb 400 carbon media. The town will test the treated water for PFAS quarterly for the next year in accordance with appropriate protocols to insure that the carbon is working.
