MINUTES

Call to Order and Pledge of Allegiance

Chairman Brown called the public hearing to order at 6:15 p.m. in the Town Hall Meeting Room.

<u>Public Hearing to Discuss 2020 Small Cities Program Application for East Hampton Senior Housing Renovations and Improvements</u>

Jenifer Svelnys is working with the Town to apply for a small cities grant. These grants require certain criteria to be met before receiving the grant or funds. Paving shouldn't be included with the project used for applying for the grant. The grant can be used for boilers, limited sidewalks/curbing, handicap updates, and emergency updates to housing units.

Tom Denman, Chairman of Housing Authority, stated they're creating a handicap accessible bathroom next to the laundry room. This change will be applied to both facilities. The work will focus on Bellwood Court. There will be updates to unusable windows and an accessible laundry unit for the residence of both facilities. The emergency pull cords will be replaced and integrated into the emergency call system. At Chatham Acres the hot water heater has no shut off. When a resident is away the heater could leak and damage the flooring in the resident unit. There are 30 units in Bellwood and 40 units in Chatham Acres. There are 2 washer and dryer units per locations. They are looking into purchasing more machines to add to the facilities.

Rosanne Amenta stated that it is very important to get new hot water heaters for the residential units.

Linda Mayo, of Bellwood Court, suggested there be landscaping to go along with new proposed sidewalks. The landscaping could curb the affects of weather, like ice and snow, from possibly forming on the new sidewalks.
